SORT IT.

Before you start loading waste materials into your vehicle, separate the recyclable waste items from the general waste and place all recyclable materials into piles depending on type.

Materials suitable for recycling at the waste disposal facilities at Chinchilla, Dalby, Miles and Tara include:

- Greenwaste
- Timber
- Cardboard
- Motor oil
- Cooking oil
- Scrap Steel
- Non-ferrous metals
- DrumMUSTER
- Uncontaminated soil
- Concrete, masonry, bitumen and asphalt
- Mobile phones, cartridges and batteries
- Commingled recyclables- glass bottles and jars, newspaper and magazines, milk and juice cartons and steel and aluminium cans, including aerosols

In addition there is a Recycling Market available for reuse of saleable goods.

There are also recycling opportunities at other waste disposal facilities throughout the region.

LOAD IT.



- 1 Place general waste at front of load (near the cab) as this will be deposited last.
- 2 Place timber, concrete, masonry and construction waste to the sides.
- 3 Place garden waste (greenwaste) and uncontaminated soil in the centre.
- 4 Place motor oil, cooking oil and paint tins at the rear.
- 5 Place mixed recyclables and items suitable for the Recycling Market at the rear.
- 6 Place scrap metal and flattened cardboard on the top.

Why do I need to sort my waste?

By getting into the habit of sorting and segregating your waste prior to your visit, you will not only find it easier and neater to load, but quicker and safer to dispose of the various waste types in their designated areas at the site.
